As graduation day approaches, you may be excited as well as apprehensive. TRA will guide you through the process. Keep up the great work!

- Meet with the administration to
 - Update your progress and make any changes to your diploma plan.
 - Verify the classes you have taken and earned credit in.
 - Get your questions answered.
- Consider AP or Dual Enrollment
 - If you can handle the academic rigor, consider earning college credit while in high school
 - TRA Admin will have to approve your choices and get the process started for you.
 - TRA Guidance will make sure that the courses you choose are in your diploma plan.
- If you are a College Prep Diploma Student, take the PSAT for scholarship opportunities.
 - If you have not already done so, set up a collegeboard.org account.
 - Register for a test (October or March)
 - Tests are now all done on computer.
- Register to take the SAT, ACT, or the CLT
 - Information is in the office or at Collegeboard.org, ACTstudent.org, or CLTexam.com
 - You may take the tests several time to work toward a better score.
- Continue with your Community Service Hours.
 - Be sure to log and track your hours
 - Begin to fill out the TRA Community Service Packet (required for graduation)
- Begin to explore college and career opportunities.
 - Contact colleges and speak to advisors
 - Visit campuses. Even if your courses will be mostly online, a site visit can give you a great feel for the school you will be attending.
 - Ask about degrees offered and financial aid. Get to know your advisor!
 - Contact admissions and know what is required and when the deadlines are.
- Begin to look at financial aid for college or trade school if this is in your future.
 - Each college and trade school has their own financial aid options.
