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Class Selection Guidelines

1. All course selections must be approved by TRA Administration
2. These guidelines apply to all enrolled students whether they take their courses on or off-campus.

Middle School. (5th -8th grades). The following courses should be selected annually through Middle School:

- Language Arts (must include grammar)
- Math
- Science
- Social Studies
- Elective (An elective is optional but highly recommended.)

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FEES:

Enrollment Fee = \$150 (no matter when the student starts)

FACTS Fees = Approx \$75 (these are paid directly to this company for ADMIN fees)

Each course taken on campus is \$750 / English is \$1500 because it takes up 2 class periods

Guided Study = \$50 per week for 36 weeks = \$1,800

Study Hall = \$375 per study hall
