Course Overview

This history course is focused on America from 1491 to present time for the high school student. This course will focus on: Columbus' discovery of a new continent, the English settling of America, the Revolutionary War, the birth of the United States, early challenges of a new nation, the Civil War, the reconstruction of a nation, growth and progress of the United States, World War 1, the Great Depression, World War 2, transformation from the 50's to the 90's and ending with our modern world in the 21st Century.

Every week we will cover one unit (5 lessons), during a 2 hour in -person master class, followed by 3 days of self-study of the assigned unit, Bible reading, and other assignments as directed. Some weeks we may include different types of projects to enhance learning.

Our goal with this curriculum is to assist the student to see Christ and his role in American history, and the value of history to present day. We will discuss and learn how Christ impacted different issues and situation in American history and provide a fair analysis of the many different people, denominations, and perspectives.

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Supplies Needed for this Course

- 1. Exploring America Textbook Part 1, and Exploring America Textbook Part 2 (two books) by Ray Notgrass.
- 2. Exploring America Quiz and Exam Book
- 3. Exploring America Student Review
- 4. Binder or folder to maintain and organize student's assignments
- 5. Loose leaf college rule paper
- 6. Pens or Pencils Only use blue or black ink

The Classroom:

This class starts promptly at 1pm on Wednesdays. It will be 2 hours with a 10-minute break in between. There will be lecture time, discussion time and occasionally activity time for each class period.

Videos and media may be shown during some class periods to enhance the lesson.

At Home:

Students will take home an assignment sheet EVERY week. This will contain homework assignments based on what they learned in class. Students are required to complete this homework under parental supervision or guided study supervision. When the work is completed, a parent or teacher will need to initial that it is complete.

Grades:

Students will be graded weekly on Participation, Quarterly Projects, Weekly Homework and Tests. The breakdown grade percentages is below:

5% = Participation (Joining in on discussions, participating in class)

20% = Projects

35% = Homework (Weekly Assignments)

40% = TESTS/QUIZZES

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How to Get an 'A' in this Class:

- 1. Always do your own work
- 2. Do all assignments on time
- 3. Actively participate in class
- 4. Be prepared for tests and quizzes
- 5. Pay attention to details
- 6. Bring your textbook, notebook and other needed supplies to class
- 7. Be on time

Expectations

You may expect the Teacher to:

- Be prepared, on time and fair in the classroom.
- Respond to phone or email messages within 24 hours.
- Be available for conferences or discussions per appointment.
- Work hard to see every student succeed.
